Students will practice the effective use of sources - i.e., others' writing and research - to advance their own writing and research, in ways that are appropriate for particular disciplines. This workshop will consist of learning the differences between summarizing, paraphrasing, and quoting, learning step-by-step how to use each one, as well as practicing integrating all three into a text and deciding which technique to use when within your writing.

Students should bring to this workshop two copies of either current research-based writing or two copies of a previously completed research-based assignment.
