### Mission Star Award – Organization of the Year

This award is given to the Student Organization that exemplifies the values of Knowledge, Fidelity, Wisdom, Justice and Association among its membership and throughout any of the events they host throughout the year.

### BEST Organization Awards are open to Student Organizations in that particular category.

#### BEST Organization in a Social Category

- This organization is recognized for donating their time and energy into providing Lewis University students with fun and spirited event(s) in social settings.

#### BEST Organization in an Academic Category

- This organization is recognized for its academic contribution to serve the University in promoting their efforts in applying the first value KNOWLEDGE, the third value WISDOM and the fifth value ASSOCIATION and upholds their primary allegiance to the academic purpose of Lewis University.

#### BEST Organization in a Special Interest Category

- This organization is recognized for their unique contributions around programming both on and/or off campus as well as their efforts to stand out from other organizations in the same category (awards, recognitions, competitions, programs, etc.)

#### BEST New Student Organization

- This organization is recognized for its initial year's efforts in integrating itself to the Lewis University community and must have been newly formally recognized within the academic school year.

### Spirit Awards are in recognition of any specific EVENT a Student Organization hosts.

#### Spirit of Association

- Given to the organization that hosts an event (co-sponsorship and/or reaches out to the entire campus community) that exemplifies the Lewis University value of Association.

#### Spirit of Competition

- Given to the organization that hosts an event (contest, game, meet, match, race, or tournament) that exudes good sportsmanship, teamwork and integrity.

#### Spirit of Education

- Given to the organization that hosts an event (speaker, lecture, workshop, seminar, etc.) that has provided the Lewis University community with an enriching educational experience.

#### Spirit of Community Service

- Given to the organization that hosts an event (donate, volunteer, philanthropy, serve, etc.) in which students are given an opportunity to serve (either) the Lewis community or greater community in order to benefit those who are less fortunate.

#### Spirit of Culture

- Given to the organization that hosts an event that gives insight into their culture through the expression of an event (fine arts, lecture or other creative outlets).

#### Spirit of Diversity & Unity

- Given to the organization that hosts an event that celebrates what it means to celebrate unification among diversity.

**Student Governing Board along with assistance from the Student Organization Resource Center (SORC) will facilitate the SGB Awards process.**

**Criteria:**

- All events must occur between the months of August and March 31 during any given school year. Organizations that would like to be considered for any April events, must submit their events for the following years Awards Ceremony.
- Each Award will have up to 5 nominated Student Organizations per category.
- All nominated Student Organizations must be in good judicial standing with SGB.
- All Student Organizations who are nominated must have filled out and filed all corresponding paperwork with the SORC Office in order to be considered.

**Nominations:**

- Nomination forms will be available in three areas
  - SGB Office and/or any of the SGB general assembly members
  - Student Organization Resource Center (SORC)
- Nominations will be accepted in the following ways
  - Nomination forms
  - Written letters
  - Electronic letter via email or word document
- Nominations can be submitted by any student, faculty or staff member who can speak directly about the Student Organization and/or any of its hosted events.
- Nominations will be accepted throughout the entire academic school year until March 31<sup>st</sup> each Spring Semester.

**Voting:**

- Nominees will be announced and revealed by SGB the first week in April
- All voting will take place the second week of April each spring semester and open to the entire Lewis Community
- Nominated Student Organizations may choose to campaign for their events, but not required
- Award winners will be chosen based on the following:
  - Online Voting available to the entire Lewis community (75% weight in vote)
  - SGB Executive Committee discussion meeting (25% weight in vote)
- SGB Awards will be held the 4<sup>th</sup> week of April.
