eligibility requirements

Only full-time students are eligible for resident status.

Freshman Students

Living environments have been established in Founders Hall, Sheil Hall and South Hall to meet the specific needs of first-year students. Housing applications may be obtained in the Office of Admission for incoming students.

Current Students

Current students may obtain housing applications in the Office of Residence Life. Each student must ensure they are in good standing with the Business Office to have access to the online housing application and reapplication process.

Board charges are assessed each semester. Resident students are required to have a meal plan and must select from one of the following options:

Meal Plan

Mini plan	\$1,160	\$77.33/week
Plan 1	\$1,360	\$90.66/week
Plan 2	\$1,560	\$104.00/week
Plan 3	\$1,760	\$117.33/week

Changes from one meal plan to another will be allowed during the first two weeks of each semester only. When a student withdraws from housing, any meal money accumulated on the student's meal plan account will be removed from the account and no credit for excess money will be given. In addition, at the end of each spring semester all remaining meal money will be removed.

Room Charges Include:

- In-room Microfridge
- Telephone service with voice mail (local and on-campus)
- Premium channel cable television
- Wireless Internet access
- Accident insurance
- Unlimited laundry
- Recreation Center usage

Room Cancellation Policy

- No refund will be given for the \$100 Housing Deposit after May 1st.
- Withdrawing from housing after July 1st (fall applicants) or after January 1st (spring applicants) will result in a \$250 assessment. **-or-**
- No refund will be given after the completion of the sixth week of classes, and a \$500 assessment will apply.
