Intercollegiate Athletics

Lewis University has been a proud, highly successful member of NCAA Division II and the Great Lakes Valley Conference for more than a quarter of a century.

Flyer teams have:

- Captured 76 GLVC championships, including women's volleyball and women's basketball in 2006-07
- Made 146 NCAA postseason appearances, including eight in 2006-07
- Won the GLVC All-Sports Trophy 12 times
- Finished 10th nationally in 1996 and 2001 in the annual National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics competition that recognizes the nation's top intercollegiate athletics programs

Lewis also is a member of the Midwestern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association (men's volleyball) and an affiliate member of the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (men's and women's swimming).
